## DisAbled Hunting: A New Opportunity

The Clinton County Conservation Board is offering permitted hunting in a portion of *Ringneck Marsh Wildlife Area* for people that are disabled. Despite the name, the area the blind will be set in is not a marsh but a grassland and timber area in the Wapsi Bottoms, northwest of Calamus.

This new opportunity is a spin-off of our former "Purple Heart Hunting" and uses the blind built for that program. This is the Conservation Board's way to offer accessible hunting to folks who need it. There is no charge for hunting privileges, however the hunter is responsible for the purchase of all required licenses and tags.

We are accepting applications currently for permits through the 2018 fall and 2019 spring hunting seasons. We will award permits on a first-come, first-served basis.

We are still hammering out all the fine details but we have the basic framework in place.

 Applicants will need to provide proof of disability. A disabled parking permit will be acceptable.



- You may have a another hunter with you to assist or share the hunt, but the permittee must be present during any use of the blind or for vehicle access.
- ♦ You may use a vehicle, ATV or motorized chair to access the blind or retrieve game. The blind is located about 400 yards from the parking lot.

## **New Pintail Cabin**

With summer fast approaching we are excited to announce the opening of our newest addition to Rock Creek Marina & Campground, Pintail Cabin. We have had a lot of

excitement around the park with this new addition. The process to build this cabin was not a fast one. It started several years ago by applying for grants and getting floodplain permits through the DNR and Army Corps of Engineers. Once the funding and permits were secured we could start



the construction process. Construction began last summer and was opened for business in March.

The cabin has some great features that many people have been requesting for a long time. Pintail is fully

ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) compliant with some extra features that will make it even more comfortable for people with disabilities, starting with paved parking. The cabin will be easily accessed with nearly 80 feet of ramp. Once inside users will notice ADA compliant cabinets with a roll-under stove top, prepping area and kitchen sink. In the restroom there is a wheel-in shower stall with a high shower head and a lower removable shower wand to make showering easier. Connected to the bathroom is the



master bedroom. This bedroom has a queensized bed that can be raised and lowered, along with head and feet controls. The second bedroom is furnished with a set of twin-sized bunk beds.



The living room area has a pull-out love seat with a fullsize mattress. With these beds, the cabin is rated for 6 people maximum. Outside the cabin has a sidewalk leading to

an ADA fire ring and ADA picnic table made of recycled plastic and a large deck overlooking the creek and woods.

When we started the design of this cabin we wanted a place that would fit the



needs of people with disabilities and be very functional for everyone to use. You can look at additional pictures on www.mycountyparks.com and our Facebook page. The cabin can be booked for \$125 per night on www.mycountyparks.com. There are still prime dates throughout the summer open for reservations.
