McClintock stated the reallocation of funds from the lowa Department of Public Health for the Grants-to-Counties program will not be done prior to the end of the fiscal year (June 30, 2016) and Clinton County will soon be completely out of grant funds (until new funds become available on July 1, 2016). McClintock asked the Board to set and determine appropriate fees for well water testing for the remainder of this fiscal year. - B. Genesis VNA & Hospice Cullen stated that priorities for the current five year Community Health Assessment cycle have been set (please refer to report on file with these minutes). For 2015, Clinton County ranked 96 out of 99 counties for healthy behaviors. Cullen stated the Gateway Area Healthcare Coalition will be holding a full scale exercise on March 15, 2016 (please refer to flyer on file with these minutes). Cullen stated the school flu clinics have finished and around 37% of elementary students in the County have been vaccinated.
- C. Hillcrest Family Services/WIC Unable to attend.
- D. Early Childhood Iowa/DECAT Kreiter gave an overview of what services the Clinton/Jackson DECAT and the Clinton/Jackson Early Childhood Iowa programs provide (please refer to informational sheet on file with these minutes). Clinton/Jackson DECAT

receives child welfare and juvenile justice funding to financially support services that are more preventative, family-centered and community based. There are currently 20 contracts in place and the following are some of the programs/training opportunities that will be occurring: de-escalation training, "High in Plain Sight" training, and "Boys in Crisis" training. Clinton/Jackson Early Childhood Iowa seeks to provide resources to promote healthy parenting, improve the availability and access to quality healthcare services, and increase access and opportunities for quality preschool/childcare experiences.

- F. Women's Health Services Hermiston stated a new health educator has been hired and is doing well. The Teen Success program and Rapid HIV Testing program are both going well. Hermiston presented the second quarter HIV Rapid Testing claim in the amount of \$950.00 and the first half of the Teen Success Program claim in the amount of \$5,000.00 to the Board for their approval:

- H. Bridgeview Mental Health Meyer stated that Iowa Medicaid Enterprises is currently paying Medicaid bills during the managed care transition. Bridgeview hired a new child telepsychiatrist that works with children two days per week. Meyer reminded those in attendance that the County has funding to help the underinsured with private insurance pay medical/health bills. There are income guidelines and interested individuals should apply with the Clinton County Case Management office. Meyer stated Bridgeview will be holding a self-esteem therapy group for adolescent girls beginning in February.

AGENDA ITEM VIII – NEW BUSINESS

Discussion ensued about narcotic drug use/abuse in Clinton County. Morgan expressed her concerns and discussed current practices at Mercy Hospital to try to limit prescription drug abuse for patients in the emergency room. Osaro spoke of the Community Health Assessment priorities and the work that needs to be done for Clinton County. Huisenga stated Clinton County has a higher prescribing rate than other counties in the state. Deaths from prescription overdoses are down statewide, but prescription availability has increased. For the 2015 fiscal year, 2% of individuals in Clinton County report their primary addiction as prescription drug use. Osaro stated the challenge exists in changing provider's prescribing habits. Morgan discussed informing patients of the risk of narcotics. Malcom stated she is concerned about the increased risk for HIV exposure due to needle sharing among individuals that progress from narcotics to heroin. Maze stated she works with women from Hightower Place and when trying to prescribe non-narcotic medications, many insurance companies will not cover the cost of the prescription (even when informing the companies that the women cannot take narcotics due to addiction).
