UNFINISHED BUSINESS

GENERAL PUBLIC

DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

County Auditor Eric Van Lancker reminded the Board of Supervisors that absentee voting will begin next Monday so the flow of visitors to the building is expected to increase. He also reviewed the schedule for the Board's Oct. 22 meeting. He said the meeting has been confirmed to take place at Elvira Lutheran Church at 6 p.m.

Paul Banowetz, pending IT Director, said they will start posting the IT Specialist position to fill his job since his promotion. The new position will be filled in January. Banowetz said the monitor in the Board of Supervisors room will be replaced with points from the credit card.

County Facility Director Corey Johnson reported he has spoken with Supervisor Srp and Van Lancker about the upgraded water fountains in the County buildings with water bottle outlets. Van Lancker said it is a wellness improvement that can be paid for from the health benefits funds. Johnson added the new cooling towers for the Administration Building have been delivered and will be installed this month.

Supervisor Srp said Clinton County has been invited to send an elected official to the Stepping Up program in Des Moines. He said he has attended past programs and the meeting is paid in full by a federal grant. He plans to attend the meeting.

Supervisor Determann said the EIRSUSS board members will attend the October 22 Board of Supervisors meeting in Elvira to participate in the information being shared for the Elvira wastewater plan.

DISCUSSION WITH POSSIBLE ACTION

Custodian contract at the Department of Human Services (DHS) location: County Building Facility Director Corey Johnson reported Felicia Toppert, DHS representative, would like to control the custodian contract within the budget that is allowed. She believes the service could be better managed if the contract is through DHS. Srp said an immediate issue can be better controlled if the contract is with DHS. Johnson will bring a resolution to terminate the contract with the current contractor.

Law Enforcement Center project update: Johnson reported the Samuels Group representative could not attend due to a medical issue. The last 13 cells will be delivered on October 15. He said 90% of the first level concrete has been poured. Johnson said the roofer was on site last week. He will provide a tour of the jail for the Board of Supervisors on October 19.

9:47 A.M. Sale of County property discussion

Chairperson Hamerlinck said GIS Technician Kyle Leist has provided a report on this property that has been distributed to the Board. County Planning & Zoning Director Thomas Barnes said the legal description is old and not accurate. Barnes said legal descriptions do not match and it is assumed that the County owns the property according to the records that have been identified. County Attorney Mike Wolf said this is a typical situation where the Wapsipinicon River shifts over time. He said it requires significant resources to create an accurate property description. Wolf said that amount of work would cost more than the value of the property. Hamerlinck suggested to bank the land and use it as a wetland property swap, however it would still need a proper legal description. Srp believes a legal description is still probably needed. Wolf suggested having the possible purchaser pay for the expenses. Hamerlinck said the land would be worth more than the survey if it is swapped for wetlands. Dale Lindle said the property borders his brother's property. He said part of the parcel is not considered wetlands. He said he would like it for hunting purposes. Hamerlinck said the adjacent landowner could request for and pay for the survey. Srp said the parcel should still be defined. Srp said the expense of the survey could be considered in the sale price of the land. Determann agrees a legal description should be completed.

MOTION by Supervisor Srp to direct Planning & Zoning to develop a legal description for the parcel.

The motion was rescinded and Barnes will collect estimates for the survey and report back to the Board.

County Engineer Todd Kinney reported on a bid request in Drainage District #21. He said clay tile through the system is failing. He said the estimate for the repair, around \$140,000, will require a Public Hearing. Kinney recommended the Public Hearing be conducted at the County Satellite Office in DeWitt.
