#### **RESOLUTION 2024-190**

WHEREAS, the Clinton County Sheriff is an elected official and the Board of Supervisors does not consider nor appoint personnel for elected officials, but need to authorize payroll for the County Auditor; now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Clinton County, Iowa, that the County Auditor be and is hereby authorized to issue biweekly paychecks on the General Basic Fund, Office of Jail to Devan Galant, as a full-time Civilian Correctional Officer. This will be in effect at an hourly rate of \$21.08 during the probationary period of 6 months, then increasing to \$23.42. Devan starting date of employment with the Sheriff's Office will be July 18, 2024. This is subject to the terms and conditions of the Sheriff's Bargaining Unit agreement without further action of this Board.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Clinton County, Iowa, that said Five Year Program Amendment number one as set forth in detail be and are hereby adopted and that same be submitted to the Iowa Department of Transportation for their approval.

# GENERAL PUBLIC

Diane Klaes made a presentation about the Iowa State Fair when it was conducted in Clinton County for two years. She asked if anyone has any materials about when the state fair was conducted in Clinton to contact her. She said they would appreciate any photos, programs or other handouts from when the state fair was conducted in Clinton County.

## DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

County Auditor Eric Van Lancker reviewed the Board's meeting schedule. He said the Board's next meeting is scheduled for July 29. He said the plan for that meeting is to return to the County Law Center large conference room. Chairman Irwin said the Regional Mental Health board met on Monday afternoon to approve the new budget from the State of Iowa after legislation was changed recently. He said mental health districts will begin next year and the board is preparing for those changes.

County Treasurer Dustin Johnson said the DeWitt office is open 8 a.m.-4 p.m. every day while the Administration Building remodeling is happening.

County VA Director John Bray said the VA has been very busy. He said they have recently been able to secure several disability benefits for local veterans. He said laws have changed and he encourages all veterans to check in with him about those changes. He said Veterans Day at the ballpark with the Clinton LumberKings is July 29. He said veterans get in free to the game. Bray said his office has a table at the county fair this year.

### DISCUSSION WITH POSSIBLE ACTION

Introduction of Clinton County School Superintendents: Irwin said because there were so many new school superintendents in the County, he thought today at the fair would be a good day to introduce them. Irwin introduced Shane Knoche from Cal-Wheat Community School District, Wes Golden from Clinton Community School District, Justin Schaffer from Camanche Community School District, Stephanie Mishler from DeWitt Central Community School District, and Neil Gray from Northeast Community School District.

Historic Preservation Commission Award Presentation: Ellen Mayberry, Ruth Wilson and Christine Gilroy of the Clinton County Historic Preservation Commission presented a Preservation At Its Best award from the State of Iowa to the County for the Smithtown Church renovation. Mayberry said the commission has been working on the restoration of the church for the last 20 years.

Legislative Proposals for the ISAC Legislative Policy Committee: Irwin said the Iowa State Association of Counties Supervisors affiliate is asking for legislative proposals for the next session and wanted to discuss this with the other supervisors. Van Lancker explained the process and what the Auditors have proposed. Irwin said legislation is needed to address medical treatment payments for inmates in County jails. He said insurance, Medicare and Medicaid stop coverage after an inmate has been in jail for more than three days and then the County must cover those costs. Irwin said Medicaid reimbursement is causing issues for local providers. He said juvenile detention needs to be addressed after a recent federal law change which forces the County to use juvenile detention centers. He said the cost of that is extreme. He said the County currently pays \$186 a day for a bed at the Linn County facility. He said the State is supposed to fund a portion of that bill. Irwin said during his first years as a Supervisor that budget was \$30,000 and it was never spent down and now the budget is around \$300,000. He added County Home Rule is something the Supervisors affiliate has always talked about, and property tax reform needs to be addressed as Clinton County is currently forced to address the property tax levy cap by shrinking the budget by about \$350,000 a year for the next four years. He said the growth in the county is not offsetting that state mandate. He wants to push for more locally elected official representation on the proposed new mental health regions. Supervisor Srp said the local level government can affect change quicker than higher levels and are more impactful. Srp said he would like to continue to push for a four-lane highway 30 which he thinks will boost growth in Clinton County.

County Administration Building Project Update: Van Lancker and Irwin said work on the new entry continues to progress. They are still waiting on steel for the entry and after that is set the masonry can be completed. They said the steel is about a week out and it will take three to four days to set those beams. They said the glass contractor is expected to be on site Monday. Johnson said drywall and electric are about done and plumbing for HVAC has started in the Treasurer's Office.

Secondary Road Project Update: County Engineer Todd Kinney distributed a written update and reviewed that with the Board.

County Conservation Update: County Conservation Director Phil Visser explained the mission of the department. He also reviewed projects that have been completed in the last year including renovations to the main office in Grand Mound and work at Malone Lake including a new restroom. He said they are working on renovating the nature center at Eden Valley Park. Visser said Rock Creek is currently closed due to flooding and he hopes to open the area up again by August 1. He said the kids in the summer camp program going on now at Rock Creek are canoeing to the nature center.

County Sheriff's Office Update: County Sheriff Bill Greenwalt reviewed the work the office is responsible for in the County. He addressed security at the Courthouse and County Administration Building. He said the civil division stays busy with foreclosures, subpoenas, sheriff's sales and no-contact orders. He said the jail remains a model for other counties in the state looking at building a new jail. However, he said it is difficult to keep staffed. He said they average about 75-80 inmates in the jail. Greenwalt said they do house other counties' inmates but would turn those away if the beds were needed for Clinton County inmates. He said outside inmate average revenue can be about \$10,000 to \$30,000 a month. He said patrols and investigations just participated in the largest fentanyl bust in the County and they recently returned the K-9 unit through donations from the public. He said they have brought back the Sheriff's Reserve program, and the public will start seeing them in the community again.
