WHEREAS, Iowa Code Section 717B Code of Iowa provides that a local entity, either a city or county, may petition the court to determine an animal is threatened, and if so, the court may order what is appropriate for that animal; and

WHEREAS, Iowa Code Section 717B Code of Iowa further provides that a local entity may petition the court to determine disposition of the animal, as well as order the owner(s) pay rescue costs (transport, boarding, veterinary and other related costs), and associated costs related to the care of a threatened animal; and

WHEREAS, the Clinton County Attorney intends to file such action to determine disposition of two dogs and their related care costs based upon a Clinton Police Department case charged on July 10, 2024, and seeks County affirmation for the action he intends to file in Clinton County District Court pursuant to 717B (note: any claim or charge is merely an accusation and a person is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty or determined to be responsible by the trier of fact); now

ORDINANCE 2024 - 05

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MAP OF THE CLINTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO THE ZONING DESIGNATION OF CERTAIN PROPERTY LOCATED IN SECTION 24, TOWNSHIP 81 NORTH, RANGE 4 EAST OF THE 5TH P.M. IN CLINTON COUNTY, IOWA

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CLINTON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

Section 1: The zoning district boundaries of the County of Clinton Iowa are herewith changed so as to provide for the change of the following described property: See Lot 2 of Steffenhagen Subdivision in Exhibit "A" within the A-1 (Prime Agricultural) District of Clinton County, Iowa to C-1 (Highway Commercial).

Section 2: The change as hereinabove set forth shall be entered and made part of the zoning map of the County of Clinton, Iowa, which map is made part of the Zoning Ordinance of the County of Clinton, Iowa, by incorporation therein as set forth in Chapter III, Section 3.2 of the said Clinton County Zoning Ordinance, and the Chairperson of the Board of Supervisors in accord with Chapter III, Section 3.2.3 shall promptly note on said map the Ordinance numbers, nature of change and date of change.

Section 3: If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 4: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and publication as required by law.

RESOLUTION 2024-207

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Clinton County, Iowa, realizes that some locations in the County require lower speed limits than those set by state law, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with section 321.285, and the residential nature of the area adjacent to 234th Street the County Engineer recommends that a reduced speed limit be established on 234th Street at 25 miles per hour from Elmwood Road (at the northern City Limit of DeWitt) west to the intersection with 280th Avenue right-of-way, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Clinton County, Iowa, has received the County Engineer's recommendation concerning the speed limit and concurs with said recommendation; now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of Clinton County, Iowa, that a reduced speed limit be and hereby set on 234th Street of 25 miles per hour, starting at the northern city limit on Elmwood Road, west on 234th Street approximately 1780 feet to the intersection of 280th Avenue right-of-way.

DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

County Auditor Eric Van Lancker reported August 1 was National Poll Worker Recruitment Day and they received a few new poll workers from that effort, but reminded those who live in the County they can still submit their names to work the elections in November. He also thanked the Sheriff's Office for attending a recent election security exercise with his office.

Supervisor Srp said Rock Creek Park is reopening this week.

Chairman Irwin said he followed up with some people about a meeting with MercyOne about closing their mental health program.

County Attorney Mike Wolf said he is working with local law enforcement for recertification this week. He added his office is working with Scott County to share some of the work his office has done on truancy.

DISCUSSION WITH POSSIBLE ACTION

Letter of Support for ECIA Application for a Lead-Based Paint Grant for the County: ECIA representative Matt Specht said the County has been participating in this grant and this application would extend the program. He said they need matching funds from the participating counties. He said 12 projects are currently under way in Clinton County.

MOTION by Supervisor Srp to authorize the Chairman to sign the letter of support for the ECIA grant application for \$12,000 a year for four years.

Community Service Coordinator Program 28E Termination: County Attorney Mike Wolf said the program in its current form is no longer needed as factors have changed since the agreement with the City of Clinton was started. He said fewer inmates are choosing to do community service due to how little it pays toward the fine. He said fewer organizations in the County are offering spots for community service. He said fine collection has improved in the County in the last few years using different sources. He said this was also done to alleviate jail crowding which is not currently an issue as it was in the former jail. He said he doesn't see this as needing a program any longer. He said if someone wants community service, they work with them to find a suitable fit. He said the program has been run well when it was being used, but he doesn't see the numbers justifying the cost. Clinton Police Chief Kevin Gyrion said he doesn't think it's the right time to terminate the program and there should be a discussion about how to make changes

to the program. He would prefer to speak in private with Wolf to present his counter points. Irwin said a decision will be delayed until city officials can meet with Wolf.

Presentation of Future Options for Outdoor Warning Systems in the County: County EMA Director Chance Kness said the EMA Board met recently and are recommending the termination of the outdoor siren system due to cost and the availability of better notification systems such as warning through cell phones. He reviewed a presentation with the Board. He said there would be a cost to decommission the EMA owned sirens but believes the sirens and parts could be of value to other agencies still using them. He said before the decommission plan happens, he wants to hear from all the communities involved if they wish to discontinue. Kness said if any municipalities want to continue, it would be the city's responsibility to pay for all of the upkeep of the system. He said they would have to speak with the communications department to see if they are willing to keep operating a municipalities' sirens if they wish to keep them. George, who serves on the EMA Commission, said there wasn't a single person in the meeting who wanted to keep the sirens. She added the commission talked about ways to get the word out about how to sign up for the various apps. Srp said he would support the recommendation of the commission.

MOTION by Supervisor Srp to authorize the Chairman to sign a letter supporting the EMA Commission's recommendation to end the use of the outdoor siren system in the County and also decline the gift of outdoor sirens from Constellation.

Road Maintenance request from the City of Welton: County Engineer Todd Kinney said the city asked if the County would do some road maintenance on the main street in Welton not including any side streets. He said they are looking for general maintenance and the County would be reimbursed for costs. He said if there was something more substantial then he would reach out to the City to discuss costs. He said if the Board is fine with moving forward then he will prepare a MOU between the City and County. It was generally agreed Kinney will work on a MOU and present it to the Board for consideration.

County Engineer Services with Jackson County: Kinney said the current agreement ends at the end of this month. He said they are in the process of finishing a contract with someone for a county engineer. He said they are interested in continuing an agreement that if they needed him to work on something then he would bill Jackson County for the hours. He said Jackson County is also trying to hire an assistant engineer. He said if the Board is fine with that arrangement, then he will bring back a rewritten agreement. He said this will be a good arrangement to slowly move away from assisting them. George said she doesn't see the need to charge any additional because that's just being a good neighbor to Jackson County. Srp suggested something be included that doesn't dominate Kinney's time. Kinney said he would tell them no if they needed something that would be too time consuming. But he doesn't anticipate that being a problem. Kinney will bring back a new agreement for the Board to consider.

Security Notification System in the Clinton County Satellite Office in DeWitt: Auditor Van Lancker said discussion of the security system came out of a recent emergency action plan training. He said they discovered the current notification system is run by a third party and does not go directly to communications as the systems in the Courthouse and Administration Building. Van Lancker said maintenance received a bid of more than \$13,000 to install the system used in the other County buildings. He said there is no monthly charge after that, only maintenance on the equipment. He said a budget amendment would be needed for the office budget, but the amount could be covered until the budget amendment is done later this fall.

MOTION by Supervisor George to authorize the maintenance department to arrange for the installation of the security notification system used in the other County buildings.

Administration Building Project Update: Van Lancker and Chairman Irwin said steel work for the front entry is expected to begin this week. They started replacing windows facing north on the west wing of the building on Friday. And the windows in the old engineer's office are completed. The ceiling in that office will need to be restored.
