RESOLUTION 2024-217

WHEREAS, the City of Delmar, Iowa, ("City") is the owner of the following described real estate ("City Property"):

The South ½ of Lot 10, and all of Lots 11 and 12, Block 5, F.L. Sunderlin's Addition, and Parcel B as created and disclosed by the Plat of Survey of Parcel B, located in the NE ¼ of the NE ¼, Section 16, Township 83 North, Range 3 East of the 5th Principal Meridian, as shown by Plat of Survey recorded on March 18, 2024 as Clinton County Recorder Document No. 2024-01227, all in the City of Delmar, Clinton County, Iowa.

WHEREAS, Clinton County, Iowa, ("County") is the owner of the following described real estate ("County Property"):

Lots 1 and 2, Block No. 26, original Town of Delmar, Iowa, and

Commencing at the SE Corner, Lot 2, Block 26 of the original Town of Delmar, Iowa, which point is Point of Beginning; thence South 168 feet more or less to the northerly right of way line of the C & NW Railroad spur track; thence West 150 feet more or less to the southerly right of way line of said track; thence Northwesterly along said right of way 45 feet more or less to the southerly extension of the west line of Ridge Avenue; thence North 184 feet more or less; thence Southeasterly 183 feet more or less to the Point of Beginning; except the right of way owned by the Chicago Northwestern Transportation Company. Containing 0.77 of an acre, more or less.

That parcel of property originally platted as Ridge Avenue, bounded by and lying westerly of and adjacent to Block 26 of the original Town of Delmar, Iowa, bounded by and lying south of the Clinton Avenue right-of-way, bounded by and lying easterly of and adjacent to Block 5 in F.L. Sunderlin's Addition, and bounded by and lying northerly of and adjacent to the former Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railway Company railroad right of way, all located within the original Town of Delmar, Iowa.

WHEREAS, the City has agreed to transfer City Property to the County, reserving a 30' wide Water Main Easement, and the County has agreed to transfer County Property to City, as an equal exchange, with no additional consideration, under and consistent with the terms of a Purchase Agreement between the parties, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the terms of the "Offer to Buy Real Estate and Acceptance", a copy of same being appended hereto, and by this reference incorporated as if same had been set forth fully verbatim herein, the City has also agreed to grant the County the perpetual use of the existing salt storage structure located on the property being transferred by the County to the City as set forth in the Offer to Buy Real Estate and Acceptance, and

WHEREAS, the Clinton County Board of Supervisors finds that the Chairperson should be authorized to sign the Offer to Buy Real Estate and Acceptance, same including a provision making the final approval of the transaction subject to public comment, if any, after scheduling and holding a public hearing, a public hearing on the proposed transfer being a requirement under the Iowa Code; now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Clinton County Board of Supervisors as follows:

SECTION 1: Offer to Buy Real Estate and Acceptance: The Chairperson is hereby authorized to execute the Offer to Buy Real Estate and Acceptance on behalf of the Board, final approval of the transaction outlined in the agreement being subject to final Board approval after holding a Public Hearing on the proposed transaction.

SECTION 2: *Public Hearing*: Board will hold a public hearing as part of its regular meeting at 10:00 A.M. the 26th day of August 2024, in the Clinton County Law Center, Large Conference Room, 241 7th Ave. N., Clinton, IA. (As a courtesy and depending on internet capabilities the public may also join the meeting on Zoom by phone by dialing 1-253-215-8782 and entering the access code 9341856401. The public may also join through the internet by following this web address: https://zoom.us/join Enter meeting Code: 9341856401 and then password clinton23), for purposes of obtaining public input on the proposed sale of the Property.

SECTION 3: *Publication of Notice*: The County Auditor is directed to publish notice of said public hearing, which publication shall be not less than four (4) nor more than twenty (20) days prior to the date set for said public hearing pursuant to the requirements of Iowa Code §331.361 and 331.305.

SECTION 4: When Effective. This Resolution shall be effective upon its passage and approval as provided by law.

GENERAL PUBLIC

Judy Buntemeyer, Goose Lake, said she has been a DJ in the entertainment industry and knows the importance of sound. She believes the county residents are in danger if they lose a wired system of the sirens because the cell phone system could go down. She said she knows people without cell phones. She said the wired system is more reliable and is a good part of layering backup systems. She asked the Board to reconsider its support to end the outdoor siren system. She would like to see more studies on reliability of cell towers versus the siren system.

DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

County Auditor Eric Van Lancker reported the EMA has a radiological exercise planned for Wednesday morning. He reminded voters that his office cannot take absentee ballot requests until August 27. He said the filing deadline for township trustees, soil and water and ag extension is August 28 at 5 pm.

Supervisor Srp said he has had some conversations recently about the port authority proposal and the Scott County Board of Supervisors plans to have the discussion on an upcoming meeting agenda.

County Treasurer Dustin Johnson said his office is busy working on tax statements that included several updates from the financial software due to various bugs. He's hoping everything is now updated and accurate and hopes to have them out by the middle of next week.

County Conservation Director Phil Visser reported the annual Catfish Classic is August 25 and registration is scheduled for the night before and the day of the event. He also said the Square Financial Services that Conservation

uses to manage credit card payments was hacked and some people received emails thanking them for their purchase. He said that email is a phishing attack and they are working with the vendor to address the issue.

County EMA Director Chance Kness reported Scott County officials will be joining the radiological drill on Wednesday. He said that drill is practiced every eight years. He said he is meeting with the HazMat responders this week for various trainings and planning. He said he is also giving the presentation on the discontinuance of the siren warning system to two more city councils this week.

DISCUSSION WITH POSSIBLE ACTION

ARPA Funding Review: Van Lancker and Budget Director Nicholas Manrique reviewed the ARPA funding projects and timelines. They proposed some funds from projects with lesser costs, have been completed without using all of the assigned funding, are not happening, or have been delayed, be reassigned to the County Administration Building remodel project. They reported this proposal could assign more than \$300,000 toward the remodel project. Supervisor George said it just looks like we are shuffling money to make it look better. Chairman Irwin said there are projects that aren't being done and the funds could be reassigned. Srp said some of the money comes from projects that are completed and there were leftover funds. Van Lancker explained there could also be concerns about projects that are being delayed not making the deadline for the money to be spent. Visser said his board agreed if one of the conservation projects went over budget they would give up some other projects on the list. Johnson said some of the projects were created because there were funds available so if some things don't fit in the budget, it's appropriate to look at if we need to do all of these things. Srp said he supports cleaning up the ARPA list as proposed and looks forward to considering a resolution based on the recommendations.

Administration Building Project Update: Van Lancker and Irwin said the steel work did not start last week on the entry and the general contractor is addressing that. The window contractor is working four, 10-hour days on the project and they will soon have three crews on the project. They said the schedule was discussed and the contractors were reminded of dates in the schedule that had to be met. They said flooring for the Recorder's Office was discussed. An estimate to purchase the flooring for that office is \$30,000 and they would like to have that included in the time and materials contract with Valley Construction. Irwin said replacing the flooring in the Recorder's Office opened the potential for moving the Recorder's Office to the area vacated by the Treasurer's Office requiring everything to be moved just once. Irwin said they met with County Recorder Scott Judd last week about the potential for relocating the office and it may be possible. Van Lancker said he will contact Valley Construction about adding the extra flooring and potential Recorder's Office move onto the current time and materials contract.
