DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

The County Auditor reported that Election Day for the 2026 Primary Election would be held the following day. The Auditor noted that the current day represented the final opportunity for in-person absentee voting at the Auditor's Office and that election preparations were continuing.

Supervisor Irwin reported that the Union Pacific "Big Boy" steam engine would be passing through Clinton County, including a scheduled stop in Grand Mound. Additional meetings scheduled for the week included a Pioneer Cemeteries meeting

Supervisor George reported plans to attend an Early Childhood Iowa State Board meeting and provided an update on the restructuring of regional Early Childhood Iowa operations. It was reported that Clinton, Jackson, and Dubuque Counties would proceed with a full merger arrangement rather than a partnership model.

Supervisor Srp reported that Grow Clinton huddle meetings have been temporarily suspended

Sheriff Greenwalt discussed public safety preparations associated with the Union Pacific "Big Boy" steam engine event, noting that the prior visit attracted more than 1,500 attendees. The Sheriff also reported plans to meet with Iowa Attorney General Brenna Bird and local law enforcement leaders to discuss joint law enforcement training initiatives and the use of county-funded training simulators.

The Sheriff additionally reported positive developments regarding reimbursement eligibility for inmate mental health prescription expenses within the jail. It was discovered that the county may be eligible for reimbursement dating back to July 1, 2025, potentially resulting in significant future budget savings.

Human Resources reported the ongoing review of options for temporary staffing services for courthouse file relocation projects. The discussion included considerations of pre-employment screening timelines and workers' compensation liability associated with heavy lifting activities.

Human Resources also recognized employees celebrating June service anniversaries, including: Todd Kinney – 25 years, Secondary Roads; Adam Wilhelm – 25 years, Secondary Roads; Zach Lange – 15 years, Sheriff's Office; Amber Harmsen – 1 year, Auditor's Office; and Jeff Chapman – 1 year, Communications

The Board expressed appreciation for the employees' dedication and service to Clinton County.

DISCUSSION WITH POSSIBLE ACTION

Supervisor George presented a discussion regarding historical materials currently housed at the Iowa Historical Society branch in Iowa City, which is reportedly being closed. Materials connected to Clinton County may be transferred, relocated, or deaccessioned as part of the closure process. Discussion identified several potentially significant Clinton County historical items, including: Daughters of the American Revolution materials related to Clinton County. Historic property studies funded by the City of Clinton. Materials related to the Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church. Information concerning former Mayor Lameta Wynn. And Railroad historical materials The Board discussed sending a formal letter to the Iowa Historical Society expressing Clinton County's interest in preserving and retrieving any county-related historical materials. The Board also discussed the possibility of temporarily storing the materials within county facilities until a permanent archival location could be determined.

A motion was made by Supervisor Srp authorizing the preparation of a formal letter on county letterhead and authorizing the Vice Chair's signature.
