DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

The County Auditor, David Troester, reported that the June 2 Primary Election was administered and noted that the official canvass of votes was scheduled for June 9.

Board members reported attendance at various meetings, including upcoming Association of County Elected Officials (ACEO) and Landfill meetings. Supervisors also discussed ongoing county correspondence and continued planning for the Iowa 250 celebration. An update was provided regarding a letter sent to the Iowa Historic Preservation Office requesting the return of Clinton County historical materials for local preservation and display. Additional progress was reported on the Iowa 250 historical signage initiative, including plans to begin placing signs at numerous locations throughout the county.

The County Treasurer, Dustin Johnson, reported that the annual tax sale is scheduled for June 15 and noted that bidder registration closed on June 8. He reminded property owners that delinquent taxes may still be paid through the close of business on June 12 to avoid inclusion in the tax sale process.

County Budget Director Amber Shepherd reported that the county cost allocation plan had been distributed to the Board of Supervisors for review and advised department heads that commitment-of-funds requests are due by June 12. Staff further reported that fieldwork for the Fiscal Year 2026 audit has begun remotely, with auditors scheduled to conduct on-site work in August. Year-end financial reporting, budget preparation, and other fiscal-year transition activities remain a primary focus of the department.

Human Resources reported that the county's spring hiring efforts have largely concluded and that most open positions have been successfully filled. Discussion also included anticipated staffing requests from the Sheriff's Office for positions previously approved but deferred until Fiscal Year 2027

ISAC Legislative Priorities Discussion: The Board discussed potential legislative priorities for submission to the Iowa State Association of Counties (ISAC) for consideration during the upcoming legislative session. Topics discussed included the protection of county home rule authority, concerns regarding juvenile detention funding and state-imposed bed allocation policies, protection of natural resources and groundwater, the impact of unfunded state mandates on county governments, Medicaid funding issues affecting local healthcare and mental health services, and the implementation and stability of recent property tax reform measures. Supervisors emphasized the importance of maintaining local decision-making authority, addressing increasing juvenile detention costs, protecting critical water resources, and ensuring counties have adequate time to adapt to legislative changes.
